

Dorothy Archer Memorial Prizes General Rules

These rules apply to all the Archer prize competitions.
Individual prizes may have additional rules, for example about acceptable formats.

1. Details of prizes will be publicised on the NUF website and Facebook page, News & Views, The Inquirer, The Unitarian and Uni-News and via the GA Youth Officer and Unitarian College.
2. The competition is open to anyone, of any age who is a member of or attends a Unitarian congregation, or is a member of a recognised Unitarian Society.
3. Entries must be prepared specifically for the Archer prize competition for which they have been entered and must not have been previously publicly delivered, published or exhibited.
4. Entries must be the entrant's own work.
5. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure their entry is received by the Secretary of the NUF by the due date. The assessors will have the right to split the prize between two or more applicants if they consider their entries to be of equal merit.
6. The decisions of the assessors will be final.
7. Copyright in the entry will remain with the applicant but the applicant will be regarded as granting the NUF a free of charge licence to reproduce the entry in any format considered by the NUF Committee to be consistent with the NUF's charitable objects. This may include the NUF website, Facebook page, *News & Views* or one off publications.
8. The NUF reserves the right not to award a prize if the assessors consider no entry worthy of a prize has been received.
9. Any entry deemed by the assessors to be inconsistent with the charitable objects of the NUF or of the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches in whole or part will be disqualified.
